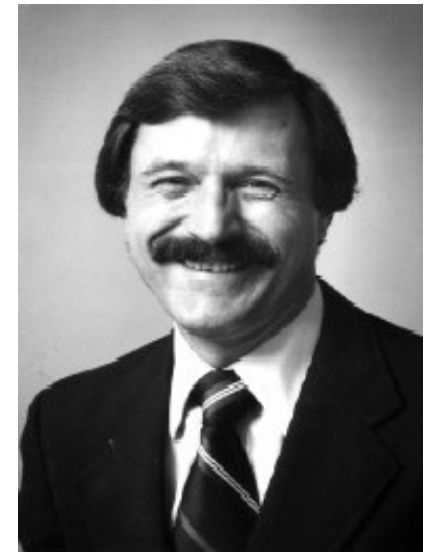

RICHARD BOSWORTH



Richard Bosworth is President of ReproMAX. He has been dedicated to the reprographic industry for over 30 years. Richard began his reprographics career in 1978 with Indox Services in St. Louis, MO. He worked to expand the company's corporate footprint into diversified markets as Sales Manager and later as its President from 1986 until 2003. While at Indox, he served on the IRGA Board of Directors for five years serving as Convention and Program Chairman. In addition, he has served as both a Board member and President of the Central Reprographic Association.

Richard has been actively involved with ReproMAX since 1984, serving on the Board of Directors for over eight years. While serving as Chairman, he dedicated his efforts to guiding ReproMAX in becoming one of the most influential forces in reprographics.

In 2003, Richard joined the ReproMAX organization and he continues to drive the strategic direction of ReproMAX today. He has led the growth of the organization, both domestic and international. In addition he has guided ReproMAX into diversification of new and profitable markets and industry partnerships.

Richard and his wife Diann have been married for 36 years and have two children and three grandchildren. He proudly serves on the Board of the St. Louis Area Foodbank and spends much of his spare time chasing grandchildren.

ABOUT THE AWARD

The Bukovsky Award honors the memory of George K. Bukovsky, who worked in the reprographics industry for more than 30 years. During his career, he served as a champion for the IRgA and actively promoted the industry. More importantly, he served as a friend and advisor to countless IRgA members. His enthusiasm and spirit were an inspiration to all those with whom he worked. After George's death from cancer in early 1990, over \$4,200 was raised for the IRgA Educational Foundation as donations were sent in his memory. At that time, the Bukovsky Award was established to honor George's memory and the contributions of others who have similarly made a lasting impact on the reprographics industry.

Nomination Criteria. Nominee must meet the following criteria: Be a current or former member of IRgA. Nominee must have made significant, long-term contributions to the reprographics industry.

Eligibility. Current IRgA Board Members and officers are not eligible to receive the award. Judging committee members are not eligible to receive the award.

Judges. Judges include the five most immediate Past Presidents of the IRgA that are available to serve. There will be a minimum of three judges. The committee will be chaired by the Immediate Past President.

MICHAEL SHAW



Michael Shaw is President of Central Blue Print in Great Neck, New York.

Michael joined the family business in 1984 with the primary responsibility to move the business from manual to automated operations. After his father retired in the early 1990s, Michael and his brother Peter each took over one of the two business locations.

Michael has been very dedicated to the industry. He has been involved with the Eastern Regional Reprographics Association for many years, and served through the chairs and as its president in 1999. He has held many responsibilities over the years, whether recruiting membership, serving the financials, organizing the convention or, most recently, helping to combine with the Southeastern Reprographics Association.

Michael served on the IRgA board of directors, as Program Chair, Convention Chair and ran through the officer positions including President in 2005-2006.
